

Auckland Together Fund

Tens of thousands of Aucklanders were directly and indirectly affected by the weather disasters and the long-term impact on their lives is only coming to light now. There remains over 1,800 displaced households, circa 10,000+ displaced individuals.

The Auckland Together Fund, endorsed by Auckland Council and the Mayor's Office, is focused on raising funds to support medium and long-term recovery of our communities from the Auckland region storm disasters that took place during January and February 2023.

The Auckland Together Fund will partner with experienced organisations providing frontline support for communities severely disadvantaged by the recent weather events. The impact of the storms on already vulnerable communities means focus is needed on providing wraparound support and tools to help whānau and communities lift themselves up and thrive.

The recent weather events have had a devastating impact on our community. Families have lost their homes and belongings, while others struggle with mental health issues and financial hardship. Access to safe and secure housing, food, and mental health services is essential for recovery and long-term solutions to support economic and environmental resilience.

Community Need

The Auckland Together Fund supports front line organisations working with communities impacted by the recent storms in multiple ways.

Our Pillars of Support

584 homes have been redtagged in Auckland alone, and close to 2,000 have received yellow-stickers.

In response to the recent weather events, an organization has provided over 1,800 extra kai packs within a month to help address the increased need for food assistance in affected communities.

Families affected by the floods and cyclone have experienced a significant increase in the need for whiteware, furniture, and baby essentials, which are not typically donated.

"Our daily referrals are up 500% from this time last year for food and household items from families affected by both the Auckland floods and Cyclone Gabrielle. We have been providing bulk food, toiletries, and bedding for many communities in both regions."

Many households continue to struggle in the aftermath of the weather events, as emergency housing may not be suitable for those affected and household appliances were more damaged than initially thought, resulting in ongoing issues such as mold.

More than 15 per cent of state housing is on flood-prone land/ More than 10,000 properties owned by the state housing agency are on flood-prone land.
